

# Autogenous Tooth Transplantation: The Endodontic Perspective

Despite favorable outcomes of implant therapy in recent years, placement of implants in developing children and adolescents is contraindicated because of infra-occlusion during facial growth. However, autotransplantation may be considered instead for growing patients needing tooth replacement.

The earliest reports of tooth transplantation date back to the ancient Egyptians. During the 1950s, numerous autogenous tooth transplantation cases were reported, but were not considered favorably due to high failure rates related to resorption and infection complications. Recently, more favorable treatment outcomes have appeared in the literature, and as a result, a patient now has the option of autotransplantation for an immediate tooth replacement. Autotransplantation is a technique sensitive procedure requiring forward planning and careful case selection, and with precise surgical and endodontic treatment, may lead to satisfactory aesthetic and functional outcomes.
